EKET IS AMONG NIGER DELTA OIL PRODUCING CATCHMENT AREAS

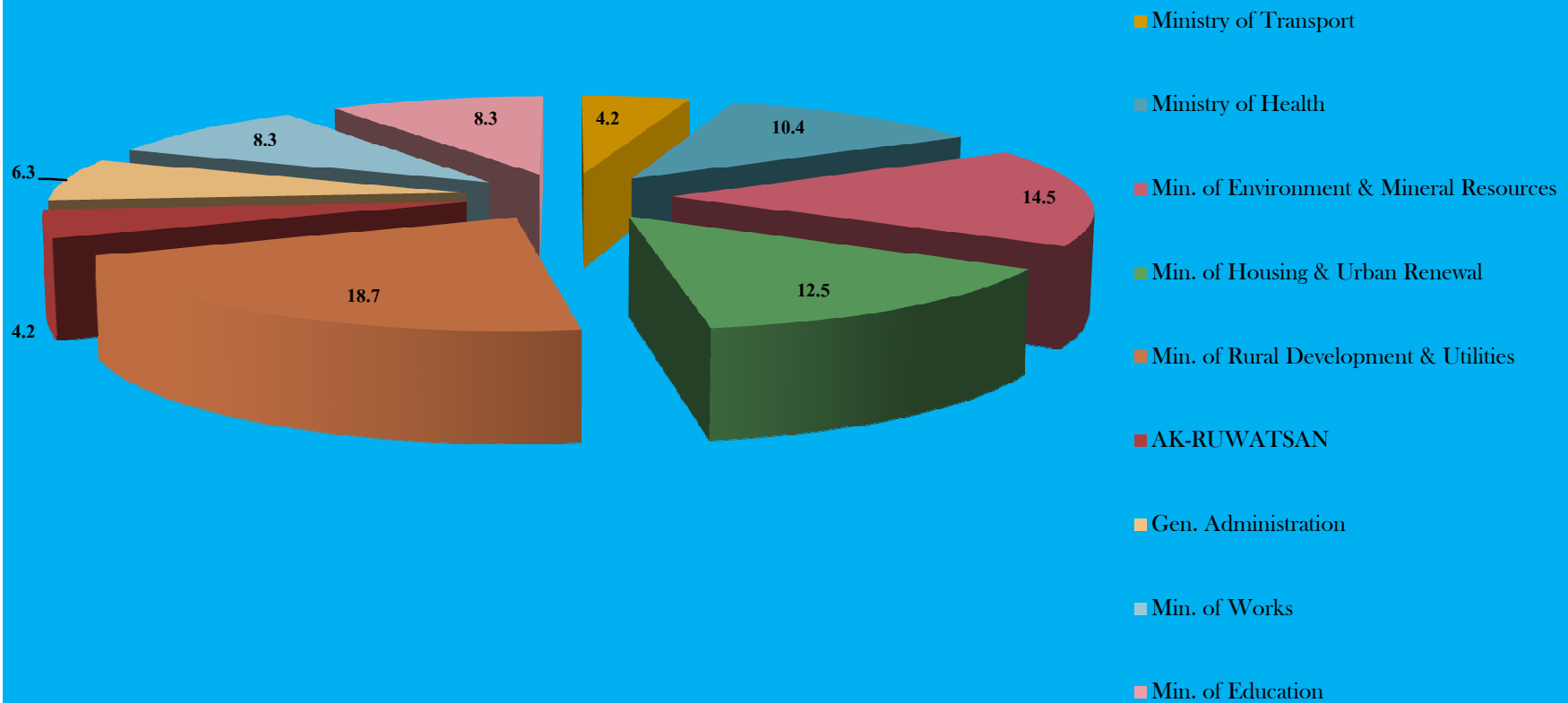
- Here is the hub for Exxon Mobil operations
- Extractive operations from this axis interlocks with pipelines to the NLNG in Bonny Island in Rivers State with O&G assets around Ibeno Terminal, Edop Platform, Osso Condensate Platform. Ibeno was part of the Missionaries' route
- Spill over effect (social dislocation, psychological upheavals, cultural-corruption, disruption of natural equilibrium of ecosystem) etc, has whittle down development realities in this Catchment Area
- The current NDDC Chairman was nominated on the strength of oil production from this Catchment Area
- It is from the production in the Osso Field, Edop Platform and others, that have made Akwa Ibom the highest oil producing state in Nigeria, presently, which culminated to Akwa Ibom State, nominating the present Chairman (Mr. Dan Abia) of NDDC, who is also from this Catchment Area. In line with the NDDC Establishment Act, this area is supposed to be highest in terms of projects allocation (in line with national production proportion)

WHAT ARE THE PROJECTS, WE ARE LOOKING FOR WITHIN THE EKET AXIS AS AT THE 2013 FISCAL YEAR?

- NDEBUMOG extracted 169 projects from the Akwa Ibom State Government 2013 budget, as it affected Eket Cluster into the "Master Factsheet". However, on our Master Factsheet, Eket Cluster have several projects extracted by NDEBUMOG. For the "Abridged Factsheet" in your hand, there are 10 Eket Cluster projects
- Factually speaking, NDDC projects for Eket Cluster are 130 from the 2013 (capital projects) budget of the Niger Delta Development Commission (NDDC), while Federal projects extracted are 18 and shall be uploaded on our website soon:

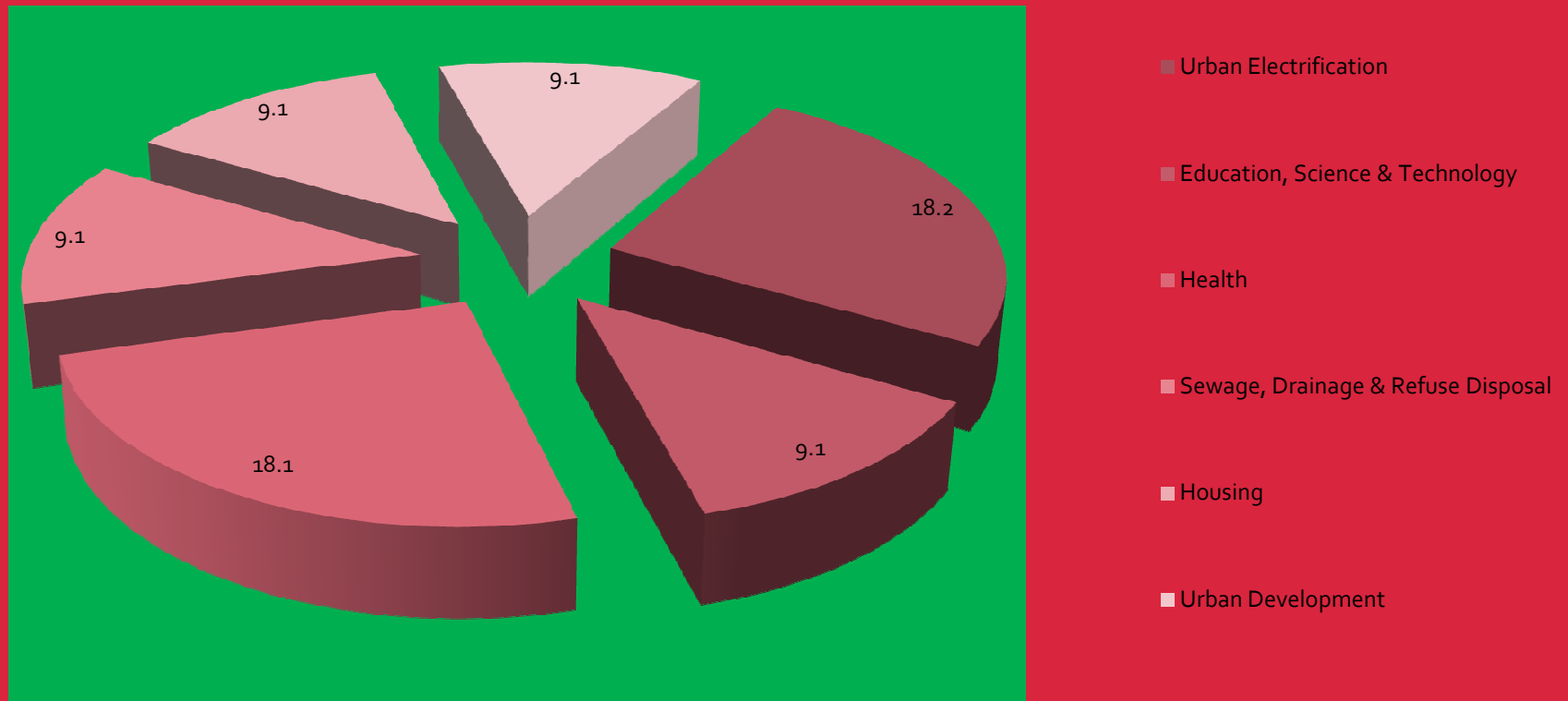
SECTORAL DISTRIBUTION OF AKWA IBOM PROJECTS 2013 EXTRACTED (SECTOR SPECIFIC)
