1. INTRODUCTION

1.0 Oxfam in Nigeria:

Oxfam is an international confederation of 17 organizational (affiliates), networked together in 94 countries, as part of a global movement for *change*. Oxfam's vision is to have a just world without poverty: a world which people can influence decisions that affects their lives, enjoy their rights and assume their responsibilities as full citizens of a world that all humans are valued and be treated equally. Realizing this vision, means overcoming a huge and complex challenges in a day to days' volatile world. Oxfam have a conviction that people can build a livelihood without poverty on their own, once, they are given a nondiscriminatory opportunity to do so. Oxfam supports local projects in developing countries, such as, Nigeria through collaborations with government and private sector companies to take and weigh interests of the poor in their business pursuits. Oxfam's campaign for equitable representation of men and women, together with other (Oxfam) affiliates and local (partner) organizations, alongside, increase of impacts on development issues on an impartial gender scale. In Nigeria, these are done in areas of economic justice, livelihoods, basic social services, humanitarian programming, gender justice / female leadership, good governance and adopting a right based approach to development dynamics.

1.1 Oxfam's Financing for Development(F4D)-Strategic Partnership Program (SPP)

For Oxfam in Nigeria, Financing for Development (F4D)-Strategic Partnership program was envisaged to create sustainable impact, whereby; more Nigerians, especially, women, are empowered to participate in decision making, contribute to nation building as active citizens and benefit from better living standards through increased availability of essential services. Similarly, on the long-term, the SPP's outcome is projected to generate a situation of improved policies and practices of governance in the public and private sector, which would result in reduction of poverty and extreme inequality through effective and efficient management of Nigeria's (tremendous) resources and increased citizens participation.

Oxfam's pathway to change has been planned at 5 levels, namely; ***improved policies of government, improved policies of private sector, strengthened CSOs, increased citizens' Voice***, and finally, **building stronger and wider alliances**. The beneficiaries are mainly, the Nigerian people, workers, CSOs, local communities, market women, small scale farmers, artisans, traders, ministries, departments and agencies of government (MDAs), local governments and the private sector, among others.

1.2 Scope of Mapping and Methodology Used

With support from Oxfam in Nigeria, (we the) Niger Delta Budget Monitoring Group (www.nigerdeltabudget.org) conducted a mapping of fiscal governance NGOs, CSOs, FBAs and CBOs through sampling of capacity questionnaire that was targeted to measure fiscal capacity needs of stakeholders, particularly, non- state actors. The mapping (methodology) that was embarked, led to the discovery of reasonable number of

stakeholders, which hitherto, may not have been fiscally integrated (thematically) with (relevant) INGOs projects' and programs on (fiscal) governance in Nigeria. Such are organizations, alongside, some prominent and renowned ones captured in this directory.

1.3 Rationale and Objective for the Mapping Exercise

This mapping directory aims to stimulate new influencing methods, leadership skills, fiscal synergies, capacity and information sharing on fiscal governance at the national and sub-national levels. The mapping exercise was targeted to empower civil society and related stakeholders with improved feasibility in the fiscal sector, nationally and sub-nationally, which is expected to trickle down to the grassroots. It further serves as a resource and informative tool for stakeholders that could be engaged by any (development) institution, either; government, private sector, donor agencies and multilaterals on fiscal and good governance in Nigeria. Importantly, organizations listed in this Directory, goes beyond the number that benefitted from Oxfam's Strategic Partnership Program (Rivers, Delta, Enugu, Lagos) to Gombe, Akwa Ibom, FCT, Oyo, Kebbi, Imo, Kano, Ondo, Kaduna and Cross River, among others.

Interestingly, we have included information about Nigeria's country profile in this Directory for the benefit of non-Nigerians, who may be in country for development purposes (work) and may need information to understand Nigeria or as a guide.

Regrettably, we are conscious about the fact, all NGOs, CSOs and CBOs working on fiscal governance are not captured in this Directory. We agree, such a list, may be inexhaustible... A fact, we crave indulgence of stakeholders omitted here to bear with us.

2. NIGERIA'S COUNTRY PROFILE

Nigeria's population of almost 200 million is the largest in Africa with over 250 ethnic groups. The country's extensive river system includes, the Niger and its main tributary, the Benue. Nigeria is the 6th largest oil producer in the world and is richly endowed with gas and other natural resources, alongside agriculture potential.

Nigeria's Northern region is drier, due to the wind from the Sahara, the 'harmattan'. The region is made of plateau and grassland. The Southern lowlands received more rainfall, and therefore, have dense tropical forests. Nigeria's population is multicultural with the practice of Christianity, Islam and traditional African practices.

2.1 Entry Requirements

All non-ECOWAS (Economic Community for West African States) passports holders require entry visa to Nigeria. This is obtainable from the Nigerian High Commission. Please remember that entry visas to Nigeria are usually single and will not allow you to re-enter Nigeria. Multiple entry visas should be obtained for this purpose. Visitors from ECOWAS do not require a visa to enter Nigeria. Visitors from other sub-regions should check locally about visa requirement before travelling.

2.2 Health Requirements

All visitors to Nigeria need Yellow Fever Vaccination. Visitors should take malaria prophylaxis (especially visitors from UK and other parts of Europe/non-malaria infected areas). Please contact your doctor for recommended anti-malaria regime. For the latest update on recommended malaria prophylaxis and vaccinations, please check with the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine (for those travelling from the UK). Other visitors should contact their local doctor/clinic or travel bureau.

2.3 Weather/Climate

Nigeria's climate varies from tropical in the coastal area to sub-tropical in the north. There are two principal seasons, the dry season from the period of November to March, whilst the rainy season starts from April to October.

The temperature in the coastal areas rarely rises above 32°C but humidity can reach 97%. Inland climate is drier, and temperatures range from 12°C to 36°C. In Abuja, the temperature can rise above 35 degree centigrade.

Accommodation

There are several hotels and global hospitality brands that are available in some cities across Nigeria, such as; Le Meridien, Sheraton, Hilton, Protea, Ibis, among others.

2.4 Transportation in Nigeria

Nigeria have a network of transport map and corridors that covers both by air and road. The hubs of transport within the country are: Lagos, Abuja, Kano, Kaduna, Port Harcourt and Calabar, among others. For Marine transport, the hubs are Lagos, Calabar, Bonny, Port Harcourt, Warri and Oron, among others. There are also train services in some part of the country.

2.5 Currency and Banking in Nigeria

Nigerian currency comprises of Naira (N) and Kobo (K). One hundred kobo makes N1. Visitors are requested to declare their foreign currency at points of entry. There are several banks in Nigeria's cities for the exchange of foreign currency. Exchange rates fluctuates, depending on various economic factors or current rates for the dollar and the pound at a given time.

2.6 Attractions

Lagos

Lagos is a sprawling, steamy, overpopulated city with bumper-to-bumper traffic.

However, if you are used to bits of street savvy, Lagos can offer unique experiences. It has more night clubs and live music than any other West African city and is chiefly known for its music. The late Fela Anikulapo Kuti came from an outer suburb of Lagos. Sunny Ade, king of juju music, still calls Lagos his home, as does the Afro –reggae specialist, Sunny Ade's club- **Ariya Night Club** in Yaba, Lagos and is worth a visit, as it renders open-air **Jazz 38**.

The **National Museum**, on Lagos Island, is worth a visit for its impressive bronze sculptures and ivory carvings from Benin and for its masks and terracotta antiquities from Jos. From ancient relics to modern ruins, the other note-worthy exhibition is the bullet- riddled car, in which, Murtala Mohammed, a former head of state, was assassinated.

The heart of Lagos is Lagos Island, where all the major banks, department stores, restaurants and black marketers are to be found. Most of the embassies and big houses are on Victoria Island and Ikoyi. The three Islands, together, make up most of downtown Lagos. **Warning:** Lagos is a smart city that everyone needs to be security conscious always...

Kano

Kano is a city of thousands of years! The mud-walled Muslim city (Kano) is the oldest city in West Africa and sits on the edge of the Sahel (the fringe of the Sahara). Although it's a bustling hive of commercial activities. Its main attraction is the **Old City**, where, despite the walls of the city having all but disintegrated, the gates have remained intact. The main gate, the **Kofar Mata Gate**, leads to the Emir's palace and the Central Mosque. The mosque is closed to non-Islamic visitors but is worth seeing from the outside, especially, during the 12.30pm Fridays' prayer time, when it attracts up to 50,000 worshippers.

Next to the mosque, is the huge mud-walled Emir's palace, an outstanding example of Hausa architecture. However, no one should expect to get in without a personal invitation. Next to the palace, is the **Gidan Makama Museum**, built in the 15th century, which is worth a visit. The Kofar Mata **indigo-dye pits**, the oldest in Africa are in Kano. The ancient **Kurmi Market** is a rambling maze of alleyways and stinking lanes. But bargains, can be found here, if you take your time and have a good look around. Kano is about 835km (520m) north of Lagos.

Abuja

Abuja is Nigeria's capital and plays host to the executive and legislative arm of government. Abuja is a serene environment and presents itself, as a modern city, with excellent road network and other social infrastructure expected in a modern city.

The capital city is about 500km (310miles) north east of Lagos and, being Nigeria's capital, has several daily flights from Lagos. The city is relatively expensive but holds attractive impression of Nigeria. There are places of interests, such as, the Zuma Rock (popularly called 'human face'), Strabag Rock, Abuja zoological park, to mention a few.

Bauchi

Yankari National Park

Yankari National Park, which is 225km (139miles) east of Jos but (located) in Bauchi State, has West Africa's best nature's reserve and holds the largest amount of wildlife in Nigeria. Seeing animals here are like bits of hit-and-miss affairs. If you are lucky, you may come across elephant, waterbuck, hippo, crocodile and occasional lions. Monkeys and Baboons are easy to come across and could knock at your door in the mornings. The other feature of interest in the park is the thermal Wikki Warm Spring. Importantly, the best months to visit are January and February. If going through the park in a noisy wildlife-viewing truck is not your liking, you can arrange for one of the guides to take you on a walking tour. Yankari National Park is 900km (558miles) from Lagos. But if you get to Bauchi, minivans travel to Dindima are available, where you can then flag a bush taxi for the 30-minutes ride to the main gate. You can also hire taxis in Bauchi that would take you straight to the gate.

2.7 Caution/Security Tips

Nigeria is no different from other civilized countries with its share of crime. Visitors are urged to be sensible with their possessions. It is not advisable to go around most of Nigeria's towns at night.
